- Black Maternal Mental Health Project The Motherhood Group (national) The Motherhood Group, the Maternal Mental Health Alliance (MMHA), and the Centre for Mental Health have joined forces in a groundbreaking partnership to research and document mental health support needs for Black mothers across the United Kingdom. This initiative centers Black mothers' voices on barriers to quality, affordable mental healthcare, culminating in a seminal report that will illuminate systemic gaps and inform community-driven solutions. # **Funding Opportunities**

## **ROSA – Voices from the Frontline (Grant – UK)**

Funding available: Up to £10,000. Women and Girls' Organisations.

Deadline: 9th December 2024.

**Details:** Rosa's Voices from the Frontline fund is offering grants of up to £10,000 over 18 months to women's and girls' organisations to support campaigning and influencing work that enables women and girls to use their voice to achieve change.



The Voices from the Frontline grant will fund organisations that will raise women's voices and challenge inequality, including: campaigning for changes in policy and laws, activities such as petitions, social media campaigns and lobbying.

#### Allen Lane Foundation - Updates Criteria for Grants (Grants – UK)

Funding available: Up to £15,000.

**Deadline:** Applications received until Friday 6th December are likely to be considered in the current round, leading up to the Trustee meeting in February 2025.

Eligibility: Registered Charities, Voluntary Groups and Charitable Orgs.

The Foundation makes grants to voluntary not-for-profit organisations in the UK for work which benefits groups of people who are under-represented in UK society. Priority given to work with **adults** who are: asylum seekers and refugees; offenders and ex-offenders; older people; people affected by violence or abuse; Gypsy, Roma and Traveller communities; people with mental health issues.

In addition, there is funding for work with young people – aged 12-21 - who are vulnerable, socially excluded or marginalised with a focus on those who are persistently absent from school; school leavers with no qualifications; and young people in/leaving care.

## Lloyd's Bank Foundation - Specialist Small Charities

Funding available: £75,000 over 3 years. Charities and CIOs.

Deadline: 23rd January 2025.

Applications will be considered from charities and charitable incorporated organisations (CIOs) with an annual income between £25,000 and £500,000 who are working with people facing complex issues in England and Wales. They must have a track record of delivering services for at least one year, mainly to people aged 18 and older, and they must also be delivering these services currently.

Applicants must be providing in-depth services in one of the following eight themes:



- Addiction
- Asylum Seekers and Refugees
- Care Leavers
- Domestic Abuse
- Homelessness
- Offending
- Sexual Abuse and Exploitation
- Trafficking and Modern Day Slavery

Grants of up to £500 are also available for groups who need accessibility support to apply for this programme. The grant will help fund the cost of support, such as a scribe or BSL interpreter. A live webinar and Q&A to talk through the programme will be held on 19 November 2024 (10:30 to 12:00).

# Represent Women - what we've been up to

• The Budget We wrote to Chancellor of the Exchequer Rachel Reeves and raised our concerns on behalf of the North East women and girls sector. We believe the North East needs a regional and gendered approach to budgeting and, policy that understands and addresses the needs of our communities.

We urged the Chancellor to:

- Pake swift action on NI contributions for charities and non-profits
- Properties to funding allocation
- Listen to women and girls sector organisations
- Collaborate with Represent Women to create North East focused action plans

We will feed into a wider response coordinated by VONNE and will share further updates from them about what this means for the North East voluntary sector.

• **BBC representation** Erin had a great afternoon chatting with Helen Richardson about the government mission to halve male violence against women and girls. Keep an eye out for the story on Sunday 25th on politics North and possibly Monday 26th on Look North. Represent Women are



committed to speaking out for women and girls' organisations in the North East, thanks to those organisations who contributed to our request for input.

- On The Table Talks Represent Women hosted four On The Table consultation events with women only organisations to feed into the Community Foundation for Tyne and Wear and Northumberland's data on how best to utilise its funds.
- Funders We met with several funders over the last few months to gather data and insights to support small women and girls organisations who may not have the time to speak to them themselves. - Women's only 'Time to Talk' Session- Represent Women are working alongside the Community Foundation for Northumberland and Tyne and Wear to host a women-only Time to Talk session on March 4<sup>th</sup>, 10-11.30, at Philanthropy House Gosforth. More details will be shared in due course.
- NECA Child Poverty Summit Represent Women attended the child Poverty Summit in Sunderland. The Mayor has promised to put £55m of measures in our region, including: physical and mental health support to help13,500 people to get back into work; £1 fixed bus and metro fares for under 22s; 1500 baby boxes for families on the lowest incomes to make sure children get the very best in their earliest day; expansion of support in schools and benefits advice launched by local authority leaders to 220 more schools; a Mayors childcare grant to help parents, particularly Mam's, back into work or training. Represent Women will continue to advocate for women and girls with the NECA team and have had some vey productive meetings.
- Women and gambling Represent Women attended a session delivered by Thrivin Together
  to share their findings on the impact of gambling and women. The growth rate of women
  gambling online almost tripled during the pandemic with an increase of 13% between
  2017-19 and 36% between 2019-21. Women are also more likely to be in financial hardship
  due to being an affected other. Full report
